## Minnie Lincoln rites today

Minnie Lincoln, 96, of Grinnell died Sunday evening, Jan. 2, at St. Francis Manor.

Funeral services were conducted at 1:30 p.m. today at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Howard Lord, pastor of the Gladbroke United Methodist Church, and the Rev. Roger Gladsden, pastor of the Oak Grove Friends Church, officiating.

Organist was Marlene Toney, and vocalists were Rita and Greg Lincoln. Pallbearers were William Betts, Sandy Clark, Don Lincoln, Greg Lincoln, Tom Lowry, Martin Pearce and Bernard Simmons. Honorary bearers were Gaylord Dempster, Norman Graham, Willie Laymiller, Lewis Savage, Glenwood Savage and Wilbur Stanley.

Burial was at Hazelwood Cemetery. Memorials in Mrs. Lincoln's name may be made to Quakerdale.

The daughter of George and Lizzie Rebecca Wiley Williams, she was born Oct. 25, 1886, near Searsboro. She attended rural school and later taught in Poweshiek County rural schools.

On Nov. 24, 1910, she was married to Edward Lincoln in Grinnell. The couple farmed in the Oak Grove area south of Grinnell until moving to a farm west of Grinnell in 1937. Mr. Lincoln died in 1951, and she continued to live on the farm until 1976 when she moved to St. Francis Manor.

Survivors include her son, Warren Lincoln of rural Grinnell; her daughters, Emogene Rainous of Andrews, Ind., and Elaine Clark of Sterling, Colo.; 14 grandchildren; 13 great-grandchildren; and two sisters, Ida Barns of Santa Barbara, Calif., and Marie Glenn of Grants Pass, Ore.

She was preceded in death by her husband; her parents; her daughter, Lucile Lincoln; two grandchildren; five sisters, Bertha Stanley, Bessie Williams, Flora Wiley, Ada Messick and Louis Wallace; and five brothers, Herbert, Lewis, George, Ernest and Roland Williams.
