Peggy Loncon, 67, wife of Virgil Lincoln of 1105 Hamilton Ave., died Monday, Jan. 31, at Grinnell General Hospital, following an 11-month illness.

The daughter of William and Louise Stilson, she was born May 27, 1904, at Oseka, Minn. During her childhood her parents moved to Sheffield, Iowa, community where she received her education in the rural Schools. She was married to Virgil Lincoln Sept. 9, 1957, at Kirksville, Mo., and following their marriage they farmed in the Grinnell community for five years. Since 1962, she had lived in Grinnell. She was employed by Grinnell College for a number of years.
