Howard Franklyn Lippincott, son of Samuel Ray and Agnes Belle Lippincott, passed away following a long illness. Sunday, January 17, 1960, at Veteran's Memorial Hospital in Iowa City. He was 50 years, 8 months, 22 days of age.
