MAUDE HOLLOWAY  
LIVINGSTON

Maude Adell Holloway Livingston, daughter of Mearces C. Holloway and Mary Charlotte Pike, was born near Kirkville, Iowa, on Dec. 24, 1870 and passed away June 24, 1958 at the Mayflower Home in Grinnell.

She was a graduate of the Jefferson high school and taught two years before her marriage to William A. Livingston in 1890. To this union three children were born: Brooks, Gerald and Elizabeth. Both Brooks and Gerald Livingston graduated from the State University of Iowa, the former receiving a law degree and the latter a master's degree in English and History. Both served as first lieutenants in World War I. Brooks also was a judge advocate and aid de camp to Brigadier General Caldwell and served two years over seas in the army of occupation.

Mr. and Mrs. Livingston made Fort Dodge their home for many years. Mr. Livingston died in 1933 and Mrs. Livingston continued to live in Fort Dodge until 1951 when due to failing health she came to Grinnell to live with her sisters, Nelle and Georgiana Holloway.

Mrs. Livingston took an active part in the social and club life in Fort Dodge. She was a member of the First Baptist church, of the Aurora Chapter Order of Eastern Star, of the Fort Dodge chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, of the Art Club and Ingleside club.

After the death of all the members of her immediate family she devoted herself to travel and extensive reading and the raising of flowers which gained for her several awards from the Fort Dodge Garden club.

Mrs. Livingston traced her ancestry back to Colonial and Revolutionary days. Many of her ancestors took leading roles in working for the cause of freedom.

She leaves to mourn the loss one sister, Georgiana Holloway of Grinnell, two neices, Mrs. C. H. Gillis of Somerville, New Jersey and Mrs. W. E. Falconer of Walla Walla, Washington and several cousins, Mrs. Arthur Brown and Jay Stewart of Jefferson and Mrs. T. G. Garfield of Ames.

Funeral services were held on Friday, June 27 in the chapel of the First Baptist church, Fort Dodge with burial in Grinnell land cemetery. Home was in Grinnell.
