James Andrew Long was born Jan. 12th, 1871, in Poweshiek county and died at a Des Moines hospital on Oct. 24th, 1955.

The son of Andrew Long and Mary Ann Morrison, he was united in marriage on Feb. 14th, 1900, with Ella A. Cooper, who survives.

Surviving are three sons, Lawrence of Wichita, Kans.; James of Montezuma; Francis of Des Moines; and a brother, Edward of Sac City.

A daughter, Mary L. Wilson of Farmington, Ill., preceded him in death on Sept. 1st, 1934.

A farmer all of his life in the Ewart vicinity, he retired in 1945 and moved to Grinnell.

Funeral services were held Oct. 28th from the Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. Donald Skiles and the Rev. John DeLong officiating.

Masonic burial was conducted by the Montezuma Lafayette Lodge and interment was at Ewart.

A 32nd degree Mason he was a member of the Masonic Lodge of Montezuma. He was also a member of the Presbyterian church, and, after moving to Grinnell, attended the Methodist church.
