He was a graduate of the Corning, Iowa, High school, and also attended Iowa State College at Ames.

He was united in marriage to Miss Sue Nagy, of Kansas City, Missouri, on December 23, 1921, at Des Moines, Iowa. One daughter, Dorothy Jean, now Mrs. Robert Bidstrup, of La Grange, Illinois, was born to this union.

By occupation, Mr. Long was a draftsman and held several positions with large steel and radio manufacturing companies. His last employment was in the engineering department of the Boeing Aircraft Company of Wichita, Kansas.
