

MARSH. The Marsh Family.

I. John Marsh, the immigrant, came from England in 1633. Settled in Mass. Colony. In 1636 was one of the band who settled Hartford, Conn. He was b. abt. 1618, d. Sept. 28, 1688. His name is on "The Monument" back of the Centre Cong. church of which he was one of the founders. He m. Anne, dau. of Gov. Webster and his wife Anne Shatswell. Gov. Webster was the 5th Colonial Governor of Conn. (Members of this family are eligible to the Soc. of Col. Dames). Gov. Webster came from Warwickshire, England.

II. John, Jr., b. about 1643, m. 1st in 1666 Sarah Lyman, had 12 children. Joseph a twin bro. of Nathaniel, was the ancestor of the fam. John m. 2nd Susannah Butler, she had one child, Susannah.

III. Joseph, b. Mar. 5, 1671, m. Hannah - - - abt. 1696; became a proprietor in Lebanon, Ct., in 1697. He was known as Capt. Joseph Marsh. He d. in Lebanon, Ct., 1753.

IV. Jonathan, son of Joseph, bapt. Sept. 23, 1713, m. 1733, Alice Newcomb (b. Mar. 24, 1712, d. 1752). They lived in Lebanon and Tolland, Ct., and moved to Norwich, Vt. (Abram, bro. of Levi Marsh and father of James preached in Tolland 40 years.)

V. John m. 1st Sarah Hammond. On tombstone in Queechee Cem. it reads: Died 1790 aged 57 years. John m. 2nd Cynthia Adams. They had a son John. (The given name of Hammond came into the family from this grandmother.)

VI. Abram, son of John and Sarah was b. 1764 at Lebanon, Ct., d. at Hartford, 1808 (tombstone record). He m. Mary (Polly) Dutton, b. 1773, when she was 17. Died 1851 aged 78 years, at Sharon, Vt. Buried in Queechee, Vt. Married Abram Marsh Jan. 25, 1790. Their children:

1. Lora b. Jan. 6, 1791, m. Timothy Percival, 9 chil.
2. Sarah b. Nov. 1, 1792, m. Alvah Sabin, no children.
3. Lyman, b. Mar. 3, 1795, d. in early manhood, unmarried.
4. Mary, b. Aug. 7, 1797, m. Francis Morril, one child.
5. Hammon, b. Jan. 2, 1800, m. Catherine C. Etheridge, four children: Wm., Sophia, Loretta and Mary. He d. Feb. 25, 1881, at Paris, Kenosha Co., Wis.
6. Abram, b. June 15, 1802, m. 1st Rhoda Short, had two chil., James one of them. M. 2nd Mary Cooley.
7. Alice Ann b. June 25, 1805, d. unmarried.
8. Levi H., b. Jan. 7, 1808, m. 1st Mar. 13, 1842, Edith Cooper. She d. aged 28, leaving 2 chil., one d., the other Ellen C. Married 2nd Edith Hall.

The Grinnell Herald says Levi H. Marsh and his family came to Grinnell Oct. 5, 1854, from Vermont.

MARSH. Levi E., son of Abram Marsh, was b. Queechee, Hartford, Vt., Jan. 7, 1808, and d. in Grinnell May 8, 1886. Ob.

MARSH, Mrs. Edith H., b. Springfield, Vt., 1815, daughter of Daniel Hall of Jeffry, N. H., he the son of Nathan Hall of Connecticut. Her mother, Annie (Dutton) Hall b. Westmoreland, N. H., daughter of Stephen Dutton of Chelsford, Mass. She m. at Hartford, 1842, Levi Hazen Marsh. Mother of five children, Mrs. Mary E. Buck, George, Charles H., Ella E., and Hammond L. Edith Hall Marsh d. at Grinnell Apr. 15, 1909, at her home, aged 88, a resident of Grinnell 48 years. She was the mother of five children, four of them b. in Queechee, Vt., on the farm of his grandfather.

MARSH, Geo. D., Rev. D.D., d. Sept. 2, 1913 in Bulgaria. Was b. Queechee, Vt., Dec. 12, 1844, m. 1875 Ursula C. Clarke. Ob.

MARSH, Mrs. Pauline, d. in Chester at the home of her son, Rodney, Dec. 5, 1885, aged 86. Left no children except Mr. Marsh.

MARSH, Rodney, b. Cayuga county, N. Y. 1837, only son of Thomas and Paulina (Brown) Marsh, m. 1862, Mary J., daughter of Joseph Carver of N. Y. Mr. Marsh served in the Civil war. His children were Harlan J., Delia, Delia, and Lula. Died at age of 73.

MARSH, Jasper N., b. Lee county 1844, son of Isaac L. and Martha A. (Williams) Marsh, natives of Drake county, O. In 1839 came to Lee county. Jasper Marsh m. 1869 Nancy S. Saunders, daughter of Aaron A. and Harriet E. (Dudley) Saunders of Union township. Her parents were natives of Ohio, having been reared in the vicinity of Jamestown. Came to Poweshiek county in 1851 and had nine children.
