"Mrs. Mary E. Marsh, wife of Rev. H. L. Marsh of Wichita, Kas, died June 20 in a Chleago hospital, where she had gone about a month ago for an coperation. The immediate cause of death was heart trouble. Mrs. Marsh was 55 years of age and had resided with her husband in Wichita about eight years. Besides the husband, she is survived by eight children five sons and three daughters-as follows: William, Glenn, and Eugene of Wichita, Fred of Folger, Colo., and Paul of El Dorado, Kas, Miss Ethel L. Marsh of Chicago, Mrs. H. C. Jones of Wichita, and Miss Edna Marsh of El Dorado.
