Jennie Martens, daughter of
Englebert and Pauline Martens, was born March 4. 1890,
on a farm east of Hartwick.
She received her education in the rural and public Hartwick schools.

Miss Martens lived all her life in Hartwick and community with the exception of the last ten years when she lived

in Victor with her brother-inlaw and sister, Mr. and Mrs. Felix DeCaluwe. She had been in poor health for the past year and had been in the Plaine Crest nursing home at Belle Plaine where she died Jan. 17, 1966, at the age of 75.

She is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Felix (Clara) De Caluwe of Victor and Mrs. Emil (Grace) De Rycke of Hartwick; and one brother, Fred Martens of Chelsea.

Preceding her in death were her parents; five sisters, two of whom died in infancy; and one brother.
