## Roy 'Slim' Martin

Roy "Slim" Martin, 87, a resident of Grinnell since the early 1940s, died at his home Wednesday, March 23.

Funeral services were conducted Saturday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Lon L. Lewis, pastor of the United Methodist Church, officiating. Organist was James Severe, and soloist was Milton Severe.

The son of Lester J. and Lulu DeWald Martin, he was born March 27, 1907, in Hopkinton. He received his education in the Hopkinton and Cedar Rapids school districts. Following his education he worked for the Cedar Rapids Parks and Recreation Department. He later became an independent cabinet maker, working for the Carpenters and Joiners Local 1835.

During World War II he served with the U.S. Army. Following the war he returned to Grinnell and continued working as a carpenter, retiring in 1972.

Mr. Martin was a member of the American Legion. He is survived by several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, six brothers and four sisters.
