The death of Mr. T. D. Matteson of acused a feeling of profoundest sorrow is among our citizens. His illness was of short duration. He had been confined to his home a week on account of heart trouble, but his condition was not considered dangerous by his relatives and friends. About 9 o'clock Wednesday evening, without any apparent pain, his life went out as peacefully as a person closing his eyes in sleep. His wife was at his bedside, reading to him at the time, and she received no warning of the approaching end.
