Mrs. Church Meigs Dies at Marshallt'n

Mrs. Juliana S. Meigs. 201 North Third street, a resident of this city for many years, died at her home at 4:30 o'clock this morning. She had been in poor health for the last twenty-three years, and suffered a stroke of apoplexy last Thursday, from which she never recovered.

Mr. Meigs died in 1910 and for the last fifteen years Mrs. Meigs made her home in this city where she was cared for by Mrs. N. F. McClay, a cousin. She was a life long member of the Congregational church.

Besides her two sons and daughter she is survived by eleven grandchildren.

The funeral was held from the home at 9:30 o'clock Thursday morning. The services were in charge of Rev. W. K. Williams and burial will be in the Meigs lot in the Malcom cemetery.—Times Republican.
