## Marion Meredith

Marion Meredith, 86, of Brooklyn died Monday, April 12, at the Brookhaven Nursing Home.

Funeral services for Mrs. Meredith were conducted Friday at the Nevenhoven Funeral Home in Brooklyn, with the Rev. Kalen K. Fristad, pastor of the Grace United Methodist Church, officiating. Mrs. Meredith worked for the U.S. Postal Service in Brooklyn for 29 years. She moved to Hillside Apartments in 1976, living there until April 1989 when she became a resident of Brookhaven.

She was a member of the Grace United Methodist Church, the UMW and Circle. She was a charter member of the BBB Club and was a long-time member of the South Side Circle and the Honey-suckles.

Surviving are her daughter, June Gropper of Grinnell; two brothers, Burleigh Malott of Tilbury and L.B. "Larry" Malott of Little Current, Manitoulin Island, Ontario; three grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.
