Floyd Miller dies at 58

Floyd Leroy Miller, 58, of Kellogg, a longtime resident of that community, died Saturday evening at Mercy Hospital in Des Moines.

Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Tuesday at the Kellogg United Methodist Church, with the Rev. Carl Klein officiating. Burial was at Our Silent City Cemetery, Kellogg. The Johnson-Reese Chapel in Newton was in charge of arrangements.

The son of Clyde and Marie Tish Miller, he was born May 8, 1918, at Searsboro. He attended Newton, Searsboro and Kellogg schools.

On Nov. 23, 1938, he was married to Elizabeth Hartgers at Sully.

A veteran of the U.S. Navy during World War II, Mr. Miller worked for Smith-Jones, Midwest Division, for 43 years. He was plant superintendent there at the time of his death. He attended the Kellogg United Methodist Church, had served as fire chief in Kellogg since 1943, was a special deputy for Jasper County, and served on the Kellogg City Council for several years.

Survivors include his wife, Elizabeth; a son, Robert of Austin, Tex.; four grandchildren; two brothers, Claire of Kellogg and Ivan of Platte City, Neb.; a sister, Mrs. Owen (Esther) Barr of Newton; and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Miller of Newton.

He was preceded in death by a brother, Lloyd "Bing" Miller, in 1972.
