

Belle Millgate (Sylvester) Services Today

Belle Millgate, 83, a resident of the Brooklyn community until her illness a few years ago, died Saturday, Jan. 19, at St. Francis Manor, where she had been a patient since February of 1972.

The daughter of Marcus and Betsy Hulse Dillsaver, she was born on June 2, 1890, at Brooklyn. She received her education in the rural schools of that community.

On Dec. 17, 1921, she was married to Sylvester Millgate in Newton. Her husband practiced veterinary medicine in Brooklyn for 65 years. She was a life-long resident of Brooklyn, and for a number of years she helped her brother repair clocks and watches. After his death she was employed at an implement company.

Survivors include her husband and her cousins. She was preceded in death by her parents; a brother, James Dillsaver; and a sister, Mrs. William McKeag.

Funeral services for Mrs. Millgate were held at 2 p.m. today (Monday) at the Bethel Church, with the Rev. Morris Hay and the Rev. Ralph

Maddison officiating. Pianist was Mrs. Morris Hay, and vocalist was Connie Huff. Pallbearers were James Calderwood, Charles Calderwood, Edwin Richardson, Robert Richardson, and Walter Richardson. Burial was in the Bethel Cemetery.
