

Rites Held for Mr. Millhollin

Myron B. Millhollin, 66, of 1608 Sixth Ave., died Friday morning, January 21, 1972, at the Grinnell General Hospital, following an illness of four months.

The son of William and Edith Downing Millhollin, he was born Dec. 25, 1905 at Guthrie Center, Iowa. He attended the rural schools in Guthrie County and graduated from Guthrie Center High School in 1925. He was married to Thressa Brown on August 27, 1928 in Des Moines and since his marriage has lived in Grinnell. He was employed for thirty years by the Rock Island Railroad as a cashier in the freight department and had also been employed by the Bates Flower Shop and the George and Hoyt Hardware.

He was a member of the Grinnell United Methodist Church, the Methodist Men Club, and sang in the church choir for many years. He was a charter member of the Grinnell Baseball Association, and worked with the Boy Scout and the Cub Scouts. He was a member of the Odd Fellows Lodge for forty-three years and also a member of the Railways Clerks' Union.

He is survived by his wife, Thressa; a son, Larry, of Cedar Rapids; a daughter, Mrs. Richard (Mylene) Hanzelka of Bettendorf; five grandchildren, Michael, James and Melissa Millhollin and Kristine and Susan Hanzelka; a sister, Mrs. Helen Lower, of Newton and a brother, Kenneth, of Cedar Rapids; and his nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, a brother Maynard and a sister who died in infancy.

Funeral services for Mr. Millhollin were Monday afternoon, Jan. 24, at 2 p.m. at the James-Schalinske Funeral Home. The Rev. J. Eugene Young officiated and burial was in Hazelwood Cemetery.
