MRS. E. J. MILLINGTON.

Mrs. Erin J. (Brown) Millington was born in Pownal, Vermont, June 30, 1827. She was married to John Millington March 25, 1847. To them five children were born, two of whom preceded her to the Heavenly home.

Mrs. Millington was converted and baptized in the Baptist church in Petersburg, N. Y., in the summer of 1847, since which time she has lived a true and consistent Christian life. She was a member of the Congregational church of this city at the time of her decease.

Mr. and Mrs. Millington moved from Petersburg, N. Y., to Dodgeville, Wis., in 1853 where they lived several years. From there they went to Minnesota, then to Iowa, and on account of poor health they moved to Fort Collins, Colo., where a number of years were spent. In 1904 they came to Grinnell where the remaining days of her life were spent till she fell asleep July 21st, 1906. A husband and three children, Francis E. Secor, of New Windsor, Colo., Ella L. Wetmore, of this city, and Elmer E. Millington, of Bellevue, Colo., remain to mourn their irreparable loss.
