Rex Millslagle Died Monday

Popular Grinnellian Dies
After Lingering Illness

Rex Leroy Millslagle passed away at 6:30 p.m. Monday at his home, 531 Tenth avenue, after a critical illness from a heart ailment. He had been totally incapacitated for several months. He had passed his fortieth birthday Dec. 31.

Rex was born in Grinnell and had lived all his life here. He was the son of Fred Leroy and Myrtle McCoy Millslagle. For many years he had been an active and obliging salesman for the Star Clothing company and was well and favorably known all over the community.
