## MRS. RUFUS INMAN MITCHELL.

Emma Maretta McMorris was born in Coshocton county, Ohio, December; 4, 1855, and died in Grinnell, Ia., August 26, 1921, at the age of 66 years, 8 months and 22 days.

In 1880 she together with her mother, brothers and sisters, moved to Decutur county, Iowa. On August 30, 1882, she was united in marriage to Rufus Inman Mitchell. To this union was born one son, Charles Warren, who with his father survives her. Of her three brothers and three sisters, all have gone before her except one, James F. McMorris, of Leon, Iowa. Brief funeral services were conducted by Dr. W. C. Wasser at the home, 1011 Summer street, Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock. Mrs. Donna Schilling, of Sigourney, sang "Abide With Me" and "One Sweetly solemn. Thought." Her body was taken to Albia, her former home, early Monday morning, where formal funeral services were held and interment was made.
