

## Everett Mitchell, 62, Dies at Gilman; Rites Here, Lynnville Burial

Everett Mitchell, 62, was found dead at his home in Gilman Friday afternoon by neighbors who became concerned when they realized they had seen him sitting in a chair by a window for several hours. Death presumably was due to a heart attack. Mitchell had undergone surgery in June.

The Rev. C. E. Kingsley will conduct funeral services at James funeral home here at 2 o'clock Tuesday. Burial will be in Woodland cemetery, Lynnville.

Son of Dave and Ida Mitchell, Mitchell farmed in the Lynnville vicinity until a few years ago, when he retired and moved to Gilman. He was never married.
