Mrs. Theodore Mithelman Passes

Wilhelmina Topp, daughter of Joe Topp, was born in the Province of Mecklenburg, Germany, on the 10th of August, 1857, and passed away at her home in Malcom on October 5th, 1932, at the age of 75 years, 1 month and 25 days. It is supposed that she spent her early years in Germany and then came to this country with her parents who settled at Mokena. Illinois. There it was that she made the acquaintance of Theodore Mithelman, to whom she was united in marriage December 4, 1874. After the marriage the couple moved to Kellogg, Iowa. Later on, about the year 1895, they moved to a farm in Sheridan Township.
