Funeral Services At Kellogg For Mrs. Max Moberly

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon from the Kellogg Christian church for Mrs. Max (Helen Louise) Moberly, 63, who died Sunday morning at a Newton hospital.

Officiating at the services was the Rev. Herbert Miller. Interment was in Our Silent City cemetery.

Mrs. Moberly had been a resident of Kellogg for 43 years.

The daughter of Ernest G. and Louise Wood Edwards, she was born Jan. 22, 1900, at Norridgewock, Me. The family moved to LaJuanta, Colo., when she was two years old and she attended schools there. She was graduated from Sargent School for Girls in Boston, Mass., and the American College of Physical Education in Chicago.

On Sept. 11, 1920, she was united in marriage with Max Moberly at LaJuanta, Colo. For 20 years, Mrs. Moberly was employed as a secretary at the One Minute Corp. of Kellogg.

Survivors include her husband, Max; one son, Dick Moberly of Des Moines; two grandchildren; and one brother, Gard V. Edwards of Beverly Hills, Calif. She was preceded in death by her parents and one brother.

Mrs. Moberly was a member of Eastern Star No. 150 of Kellogg and the American Legion Auxiliary.
