Roy T. Molloy, 97, of Malcom, died Friday morning at Iowa Veterans Hospital in Knoxville. Jan 5

Funeral services for Roy Molloy were held at 1 p.m. today (Monday) at the Smith Funeral Home, with Dennis Dorsheimer, pastor of the Jackson Church of Christ in Montezuma, officiating. Organist was Alice Renaud.

Born Sept. 23, in Jasper County, 1891, he was the son of James and Eliza Ann Wertz

Malloy. When still a small child, he moved with his family to Albion, where he received his education and grew to manhood.

On Sept. 5, 1918, he entered the U.S. Army medical corp. and served during World War I in France and the United States. He married Ruth May Weber on Sept. 22, 1920 on a farm near Hornick, Iowa. Following their marriage, the couple farmed west of Newburg, where he worked raising Polland China Hogs.

He was a member of the Newburg school board and coached boy's and girl's basketball in the Newburg school system. He was a former member of the Hickory Grove United Brethren Church, where he was active in many offices.

In 1956, the couple moved to the Chester area, and four years later to an acreage near Malcom. He had spent the last five years at the Knoxville hospital.

He is survived by his wife, Ruth, of Montezuma; two daughters, Mrs. Phillip (Zelda) Watt of Montezuma and Mrs. George (Jean) Morrison of Malcom; two sisters, Mrs. Bertha Kirkendall of Albion and Mrs. Lida Greene of Des Moines; ten grandchildren; and one great-grandchild.

He was preceded in death by his parents, two sisters, and one brother.
