

Last Rites Said For Cliff Monroe

Funeral services were held at 1:30 p.m. today (Thursday, Oct. 7) at the Smith Funeral Home for C. Clifford Monroe, 59, of 105 6th Ave., who died suddenly Monday afternoon at his home. He had not been in the best of health the past few years.

The Rev. Newell E. Davis, pastor of the United Church of Christ-Congregational, officiated at the services.

He and his family then moved to Wellman where he graduated from the Wellman High School. Following his graduation he moved to Washington, Iowa.

On June 22, 1936, he married Nellie Askea in Sigourney. To this union were born four children—Gerald F. Monroe of Des Moines, Mrs. James (Patricia R.) Collum of Grinnell, James M. Monroe of Iowa City, and Steven L. Monroe at the family home.

Mr. and Mrs. Monroe came to Grinnell in 1939. Mr. Monroe was a member of the United Church of Christ Congregational, a member of the Hennion Lodge No. 273 A.F. & A.M. and was a past exalted ruler of the B.P.O.E. Lodge No. 1236. Mr. Monroe had been associated with the town Highway Commission as an inspector.
