

## Funeral of Mrs. <sup>8-12-1932</sup> James Morrissey

Funeral services for Mrs. James L. Morrissey, who passed away Sunday, were held Wednesday morning at 9 o'clock from St. Mary's church with Rev. Father M. J. Hannon in charge of the service and Rev. Father William Hannon of Muscatine delivering the sermon. Interment was in the Brooklyn cemetery with Rev. Father Barron of Brooklyn in charge of the services at the cemetery. St. Mary's church choir furnished the music and the pall bearers were Charles Gallagher, Eugene Gallagher, Patrick Gallagher, Elmer Cannon, all of Brooklyn; James Reagen and Donald Ent of Grinnell.

Mary T. Gallagher, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Gallagher, was born Sept. 10, 1894, at Portsmouth, Iowa, and died August 7, 1932, at her home in Grinnell. She would have been thirty-eight years old the 10th of this coming September.

After graduating from the Portsmouth high school she went to Brooklyn where she was employed for two years at Neir's confectionery. She then came to Grinnell in 1918 and was employed at R. E. Eates' drug store until her marriage to James L. Morrissey of this city on June 29, 1920. To this union seven children were born, James, Mildred, Jerome, Bernard, Lawrence, Terrence and John Edward who was born shortly before his mother's death.
