

Grace Mowrey (Glenn)

Mrs. Grace Mowrey, 86, of Rolling Green Village, Nevada, a former resident of Brooklyn, died Tuesday night, April 18, in the Mary Greeley Medical Center, Ames. Services for Mrs. Mowrey were held at 10:30 a.m., Friday, April 21, 1995, in the First Presbyterian Church, Brooklyn. Rev. Daniel Ogata of Grinnell officiated. The organist was Mrs. Marilyn Kriegel and special selections were "In The Garden" and "How Great Thou Art". Casket-Bearers were Mike Norman, Rocky Norman, Dan McGriff, Tom McClure, John Selin, Dan Hurt, Bernie Johnston, and Dennis Elliott. Interment was in the Brooklyn Cemetery.

Grace Mary Coleman Mowrey, daughter of Henry and Eva Woodle Coleman, was born March 14, 1909 near Victor. She received her education in the Victor School graduating from high school in 1926. On July 14, 1930, Grace was united in marriage to Glenn Edwin Mowrey in Newton. They made their home in Brooklyn, and for ten years Grace worked in the Brooklyn School lunch program.

Following the death of her husband in 1976, she lived briefly in Hartford, and Grinnell where she cared for her mother. In July of 1993 she became a resident of Rolling Green Village in Nevada.

Mrs. Mowrey was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Brooklyn and the South Side Circle. Surviving are one son and his wife, Robert and Camelia Mowrey of Marshalltown; two daughters, Betty Norman of Broken Arrow, Okla., and Marjorie Cory and her husband, Patrick, of Maxwell; two sisters, Mildred Wilson of Belle Plaine and Della Welsh of Grinnell; nine grandchildren; and 19 great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, her brother, Raymond Coleman, and a son-in-law, Lester Norman.
