

J. B. McCallum **Succumbs Tuesday;** **Funeral Friday** ³⁻²⁷⁻58

Funeral services for J. B. "Sport" McCallum of Grinnell who died at a local hospital Tuesday morning, will be held Friday at 2 p.m. from the James-Schalinske Funeral home with the Rev. Fred Fish officiating.

Organist will be Mrs. Kathleen Heffner and interment will be at the Silent City cemetery at Monroe. Military graveside rites will be conducted by the American Legion.

The son of William and Phebe Ann Rockham McCallum, he was born on June 4, 1896 at Dallas Center. For the past 37 years he had made his home in Grinnell and was employed by the Iowa Highway Commission.

Mr. McCallum served in the U. S. Army during World War I and had been a member of the American Legion for nearly 40 years.

On December 13, 1944, he was married to Catherine Edwards at Newton. His widow survives him.

Other survivors include six stepchildren: Mrs. Elvera Johannes of Grinnell, Mrs. Margie White of Newton, Francis Edwards of Kansas City, Mo., Paul Edwards with the Army in Germany, Mrs. Violet Stuart of Des Moines, and Herschel Edwards of Marshalltown.

Also surviving are a grandson, Robert Perry Jr., who had made his home with Mr. McCallum, 13 step grandchildren, three sisters, Mrs. Elizabeth Kanyon of Bouton, Mrs. Grace Gestrach of Minnesota, Mrs. Hannah Channon of California, and two brothers, Ray of Dallas Center and Cephus of California.

He was preceded in death by his parents, four brothers and three sisters.
