Miss McCandless, who also served as secretary of the college faculty, died suddenly early Thursday evening at her home, the home she had shared for a long period of years with Miss Evelyn Garder, dean of women at the college. She had appeared to be in her customary good health until the moment

Bethana McCandless was born

in Sheldon, Ia., June 5, 1897. She died suddenly of a cerebral hemorrhage, Aug. 23, 1956.

A 1919 graduate of Grinnell eollege, Miss McCandless had next to the longest period of service, 33 years, of any present faculty member or administrative official. She had been assistant registrar from 1919 to 1921, under Miss Mary E. Simmons, whom she succeeded in 1925 after a short period as acting registrar before Miss Simmons' death.

She was elected to Phi Beta Kappa, national honorary scholastic lociety at Grinnell college and nad long been a member of the American Association. of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers, Last May she was initiated into Delta Kappa Clamma, the women educator's SOURCES.
