He received his education in the rural school and at 16 years of age, he united with the Ewart Methodist church, where he faithfully served as a Sunday school teacher 57 years and as treasurer 40 years. When the Ewart church was closed, he transferred his membership to the Malcom Methodist church, where he attended as long as his health permitted.

On August 26, 1896, he was united in marriage with Maggie J. James. To this union two children were born. Mrs. McCormick's death Aug. 2, 1963, came shortly before they would have celebrated their 67th anniversary.
