

## Last Services For Mrs. Andrew McCormick Held

Funeral services for Mrs. Andrew McCormick, 66, who died Monday evening, were held at 2:00 o'clock Wednesday afternoon, October 23, from the Ewart U. P. church. The Rev. R. G. Smith had charge of the rites. Interment was in the Ewart cemetery.

Pallbearers were Leo Farley, Tom Jeffrey, William Jeffrey, J. S. Copeland, W. G. Cleland and David Agnew. Rev. and Mrs. R. G. Smith, Mrs. Gordon Farley and Gus Wasson, accompanied at the piano by Miss Aima McMeekin, sang favorite selections.

Mrs. McCormick died very suddenly at her home Monday evening. She had eaten supper and was doing some painting when she was taken ill. Following is the obituary:

Sarah H. Donnan, daughter of James and Nancy Hamilton Donnan, was born near Coal Valley, Ill., December 29, 1869, and departed this life October 14, 1935, age 66 years, nine months and 15 days.

The family lived in Illinois until after the death of her father, when her mother and six children, of whom she was the youngest, a child of six years, moved to Iowa.

At an early age she became a Christian and remained faithful to her Lord and her church until the end. She was in her place in the Sabbath school and church on the day before her death.

She was married to Andrew McCormick, a native of County Down, Ireland, November 1, 1899, and with the exception of the first year of their marriage spent in Chicago, lived the entire time on the farm where she resided at the time of her death.

She was preceded in death by her father and mother; three sisters: Mrs. Susanna McGonigal, Mrs. Ella Cummings and Mrs. Mary McCormick; and one brother, N. James Donnan.

She leaves to mourn her passing her husband and three sons, William E., James A. and Eugene; a sister, Elizabeth N. Donnan, and a host of nieces, nephews and friends, who have lost a loving aunt and faithful friend.
