

Glenn McKain Rites Conducted Here May 19

Rites for Glenn McKain were conducted by the Rev. William Douglas Monday afternoon, May 19, at the Steffy Funeral Home. Music was provided by Miss Alice Underwood.

Mr. McKain, 70, passed away at his home in Deep River on Saturday, May 17.

The son of James and Nellie Soultz McKain, he was born near Gibson, Iowa, on Nov. 6, 1898. He attended rural school and graduated from Gibson High School in 1916.

He farmed at home for several years and then worked in the West Burlington railroad shops for eight years.

On Feb. 21, 1929, he was united in marriage with Delphine Nugen. To this union one son was born. They lived east of Gibson and then moved to their farm south of Deep River where they farmed for 25 years. In 1960 they retired and moved to their present home in Deep River.

He was a member of the United Presbyterian Church in

Gibson and Perfect Union Lodge No. 277 of Thornburg which merged with Universal Lodge No. 242 of What Cheer.

He was preceded in death by his parents and one step-sister, Mrs. Flossie Hungerford.

He is survived by his wife; their son, Glenn, Jr. and his wife, Jeannine, two grandsons, Larry and Garry, all of Park Rapids, Minn.; his step-mother, Mrs. Byrd McKain of Gibson; three brothers, H. E. McKain of What Cheer, Donald S. McKain of Gibson, W. M. McKain of Des Moines; one half-brother, James McKain of What Cheer; and one step-brother, W. C. Smith of Keswick.
