James Lester McKay, 79, of Oskaloosa died Saturday, Dec. 12, at University Hospitals in Iowa City.

Funeral services were conducted Wednesday at the Gibson Presbyterian Church, with the Rev. Dan Ogata officiating. Graveside military rites were conducted by members of the Keswick American Legion, with burial in Sixteen Cemetery near Thomburg.

Surviving are his wife; one son, Gary of Grinnell; a daughter, Linda Snakenberg of Oskaloosa; four grandchildren; four great-grandchildren; and one sister, Beth Ann Sypherd of Cedar Rapids.

He was preceded in death by his parents and two brothers, George and Glenn McKay.
