## Mr. McNaul rites today

James McNaul, 74, of Rte. 1, Grinnell, died Tuesday morning, May 6, at his home.

Funeral services were held at 1:30 p.m. today at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Carl Klein of the Bethel Methodist Church officiating.
