Aletha C. McNeal, 64, of 817 Summer St., Grinnell, died Wednesday evening (Jan. 5, 1972) at Grinnell General Hospital following an extended illness. She had served as director of Poweshiek County Department of Social Screices since its inception in 1934 and had resigned from the position last month.

The daughter of Charles E. and Lelin Jane McFerren McNeal. Miss McNeal was born near Monezuma on Aug. 16, 1997. She graduated from Montezuma High School and received her bachelon's degree in education from the University of Northern Iowa at Cedar Falls.

She returned to Montezuma to teach in the elementary grades and in 1934 accepted the newly created position as Poweshiek tourly director of Social Services. This position she held for 37 years and was the only director Poweshiek County has had.

She was a member of the Grinnell Manning Council in addition to nany professional organizations hier include Iowa Welfare Assoc.. owa State Association of County Velfare Directors, State of Towa Employees Association and the Southeast Iowa County Directors.
