

Mr. McSherry Services Held

C. W. McSherry, 86, of Brooklyn died Friday morning in the Brookhaven Nursing Home, Brooklyn.

The son of Joseph and Euka Mitchell McSherry, he was born May 1, 1887, in Waverly Kan. The family moved to Missouri, and later to Grand Junction and Fort Collins, Colo. He took a prep course at the Colorado Agricultural College in Ft. Collins and continued his education there. He then came to Iowa, where he was married to Alma Belle Breniman on Aug. 2, 1911, in the home of her parents southeast of Brooklyn. Mr. and Mrs. McSherry farmed until their retirement, at which time they moved to Guernsey and later to Brooklyn.

Mr. McSherry was a member of the Grace United Methodist Church of Brooklyn; Corinthian Lodge No. 174, AF & AM; a 50-year member and past worthy patron of the Order of Eastern Star, Brooklyn Chapter No. 131; Poweshiek Lodge No. 198, Knights of Pythias; Royal Arch Masons; and a charter member of the Farm Bureau.

He is survived by his wife; one son, Stewart of Aurora, Colo.; three daughters, Mrs. Charles (Elizabeth) Terwilliger of Ft. Collins, Mrs. Leslie (Mary Frances) James of Denver, and Mrs. John (Ardella) Taylor of Brooklyn; one brother, retired Brig. Gen. Frank McSherry of Diablo, Calif.; thirteen grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Funeral services for Mr. McSherry were held at 1 p.m. Monday at the Grace United Methodist Church, with the Rev. J. Arthur Eveland officiating. Burial was in the I.O.O.F. Cemetery, Brooklyn, with the Nevenhoven Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.
