Mrs. Nay was the eldest of
five children born to Horatio S.
and Belle Blake Garrett and
was born in East Waterloo

Iowa, on Aug. 11th, 1891. The

and attended the Grinnell
schools. After pursuing a teach-
er training course in college, she
taught in the rural schools of
Poweshiek county for three
years.

On Dec. 31st, 1913, she was
united in marriage with Isaac
S. Nay. Following many years
of residence at Cedar Falls, she
returned to Grinnell in 1952 for
her retirement years.

She became affiliated with the
Primitive Baptist church while
a young woman.
