Lynnville, Starr. Martha White
daughter of Samuel and Rebecca
White, was born in Perquimans County,
N. C., April 8, 1845. In 1847, when she
was but a little girl of six she came
with her parents to Henry County, In-
diana.

She was married to John F. Newby
at Ray-ville, Ind., Aug. 20, 1873. For
over 20 years they lived in beautiful
companionship—the husband having
died March 2, 1915, the celebration of
this union having taken place the An-
niversary before, the last time all the family
were together.

To this union were born six sons and
three daughters, all of whom survive
the parents, for the purity and charac-
ter of whose lives they have the deep-
est reverence.

The children are: S. F. Newby of Mt.
Sterling, Ill.; C. H. Newby, of Lynn-
ville; Mrs. Eliza Woodard, and Mrs.
Hinnie N. Parker, both of Knightstown,
Ind.; T. E. Newby, Sidney, Ind.; Miles W.
Newby, Onawa, Ind.; Earl Newby, Cin-
cinnati, and Albert, who has remained at
home with his mother. Beside a three-

children they also raised a grand son
and infancy who was devoted to his
grandparents, and who preceded his
grandmother to the grave only a few
months. All of the children were pres-
ent at the funeral except T. E. Newby,
who is too ill to leave his home.

The family came to Iowa in 1878,
and the parents with the younger mem-
bers moved to Lynnville in 1883, which
