147 Martha White Newby, * 1851

Lynnville Star: Martha White, daughter of Salmon and Rebecca White, was born in Parquimous County, N. C., April 8, 1851. In 1841, when she was but a little over six she came with her parents to Henry County, Ind. Indiana.

She was married to John F. Newby at Rayville, Ind., Aug. 30, 1854. For over 50 years they lived in beautiful companionship—the husband having died March 2, 1915, the celebration of this union having taken place the August before, the last time all the family were together.

To this union were born six sons and three daughters, all of whom survive the parents, for the purity and character of whose lives they have the deepest reverence.

The children are: S. F. Newby of Mt. Sterling, Ill.; C. H. Newby, of Lynnville; Mrs. Eliza Woodard, and Mrs. Minnie N. Parker, both of Knightstown, Ind.; T. E. Newby, Sidney, Ind.; Miss W. Newby, Onawa, Ia.; J. Earl Newby, Chicago, and Albert, who has remained at home with his mother. Besides these children they also raised a grand son from infancy who was dearest to his grandparents, and who preceded his grandmother to the grave only a few months. All of the children were present at the funeral except T. E. Newby, who is too ill to leave his home.

The family came to Iowa in 1878, and the parents with the younger members moved to Lynnville in 1881, which became their permanent home.
