JAMES THOMAS NEWMAN (Continued)

James Thomas Newman, one of twin sons of John W. and Nora Carlton Newman, was born May 25, 1911, at Albia, Iowa, and passed away at University Hospitals, Iowa City, April 27, 1965, after six weeks' illness.

Services were held April 30 at St. Mary's Catholic church in Grinnell with Rev. Leo V. Kuebrick presiding. Pallbearers were Arlo Worth, Don Sparks, John Ditzler, Eldred Gauss, Ted Critwell, Gilbert Taylor. Interment was in Calvary cemetery at Brooklyn.

He moved to Brooklyn with his family in 1913 and resided there till 2 years ago when he moved to Grinnell.

He graduated with the class of 1931 of Brooklyn high school and was a partner in Newman's Greenhouse till it was discontinued. He also was an employee of the telephone company and Y & M Hardware of Brooklyn. He then worked for Saga Foods and Grinnell College till his illness.

August 24, 1940, he was united in marriage with Margaret Mary Carpenter of Brooklyn at St. Patrick's Catholic church in Brooklyn and to this union two sons were born, James Irwin and Edward John, both of Grinnell.

He is survived by his wife, his sons, and six grandchildren—Edward, Lori, Shawn, Lisa, Stephani and Michelle Newman; a brother, Jack Newman of Guernsey; two sisters, Mrs. Howard (May) Armstrong of Deep River and Mrs. Harold (Arlene) Smothers of Cedar Rapids; other relatives and friends.
