Gary Newton, 25, drowned early Saturday in a quarry near Fairfax in southwest Linn county. Newton, an employee of Manatt's, had been work-ing with a crew on a Linn

Authorities said the body was recovered by two scuba divers in 20 feet of water about 15 feet from the shoreline. Details of the accident, which took place shortly before 2 a.m., were not available.
