
Harry A. Niece

On Jan. 21, 1956, he was married to Rose Marie Wilde and Macomb. They lived in Chicago where he worked at the Air Mail Field at Midway Airport. Mr. Niece transferred to Fort Madison in 1956 where he held a variety of postal positions. He was named postmaster of Grinnell in July 1976. His 16year tenure was the longest on record for a Grinnell postmaster.
