Raymond Norris, 76, of 1917 Fifth Ave., Grinnell, died at his home Tuesday evening as the result of a self-inflicted gunshot wound.

The son of James Wilson and Lora Culter Norris, he was bern in Grinnell on Aug. 13, 1893. He attended the Grinnell schools, graduating from Grinnell High school.

During World War I, he served in the U.S. Navy for 21 months. On May 16, 1920, he married Exther Harpster at Davenport, Iowal and the couple continued to make their home in Grinnell. He was associated with his brother Paul in operation of the J.W. Norris oil station for a number of years until his retirement in 1960.

Mr. Norris was a member of the Methodist church, having served in a number of lay activities. He was a member of the official board, the church's building committee and the Methodist Men's Club.
