

**Mrs. Ezra Nuckolls  
Dies Peacefully In  
Pasadena, Calif.**

Mrs. Ezra Nuckolls, mother of R. F. Nuckolls of this city, passed peacefully away in her sleep Saturday morning in Los Angeles, Calif., where she had been spending the winter with her daughter, Mrs. F. C. Hammond.
