

L. H. Nutting 5-14-1935 Passes Away

Many Grinnell friends will regret to learn of the death of L. H. Nutting for many years a resident and active business man of Poweshiek county who passed away in Davenport last Friday. Mr. Nutting paid frequent visits to this county in which he always kept his interest and was known as a man of high integrity and fine character.

The following regarding him appeared in the Davenport Democrat-Leader of Sunday morning:

Funeral services for Lorenzo Howard Nutting, retired Davenport hardware dealer, whose death occurred at 2:45 p. m. Friday, will be held at 2:30 p. m. Monday at the Mt. Ida Presbyterian church. Burial will be in Oakdale cemetery. The Rev. George Steele will officiate at the church and at the grave.

Mr. Nutting's death, which followed a three months' illness, occurred at the home of his daughter, Mrs. A. H. Holland, 1218 East Locust street. As a wholesale hardware dealer and an active worker in the Republican party, Mr. Nutting was well known throughout Scott county.

Following his death his body was removed to the Horrigan Home for Funerals, and Saturday night was returned to the Holland Home. At noon Monday it will be taken to the Mt. Ida Presbyterian church.

Born on a farm one and one-half miles south of Donahue, Feb. 15, 1856, Mr. Nutting had spent the greater part of his life in Scott county. When he was four years old his father, the late Daniel Nutting, became steward of the Scott county home, a post he held until 1868. The following year the family moved to Malcom, Iowa, where Mr. Nutting married Miss Della Falkenburg in 1876. She preceded him in death in 1917.

Mr. Nutting entered the retail hardware business in Malcom in 1883, but four years later came to Davenport to become associated
