Funeral services were held Saturday morning, March 20, at Smith Funeral Home in Victor for Mabel Johanna O'Halloran, 88, formerly of Victor, who died Wednesday, March 17, 1999, at Crestview Acres Nursing Home in Marion.

The Rev. Torger Johnson of the Victor United Methodist Church officiated, and organist Jane Alexander performed the selections, "Sweet Hour of Prayer" and "In the Garden." Interment was in the Brooklyn Cemetery, Brooklyn.
