Anne Oakley services held

Anne Oakley, 84, of the Mayflower Home died Saturday evening at the Mayflower Home Health Care Center. Nov 26

Graveside services were held at 2:30 p.m. Tuesday at the Ames Municipal Cemetery, with the Rev. Henry A. Campbell, pastor of the Ames United Church of Christ-Congregational, officiating. The Smith Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.

The daughter of Adolph and Sarah Iwig Richter, she was born June 24, 1892, at Rockwell City, Ia. She attended schools in Rockwell City and later attended Simpson College, where she majored in music.

On Jan. 19, 1921, she was married to Budd Winfield Oakley at Des Moines. Following their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Oakley spent 13 years with the Chautauqua Sector, and in 1931 they moved to Ames. They came to the Mayflower Home here in in 1963.
