

Mrs. Ogata memorial set

Yuriko Ogata, 55, wife of the Rev. Daniel I. Ogata of 1523 Elm St., Grinnell, died of cancer Tuesday evening at Grinnell General Hospital.

Her body will be cremated. Memorial services will be conducted at 3 p.m. Saturday at the First United Presbyterian Church. Memorials in Mrs. Ogata's name may be made to the church building fund.

The daughter of Noboru and Kukue Sato Ogasawara, she was born April 15, 1924, in Fife, Wash. During World War II, she lived in Minedoka, Idaho, after which she moved to Chicago. She was an active member of the Church of Christ, Presbyterian, a Japanese-American congregation.

On Sept. 15, 1952, she was married to Daniel Ogata. The couple lived in Fairfield while he attended Parsons College, returning to Chicago in 1955

when he attended McCormick Theological Seminary.

They moved to Clinton in 1958 where the Rev. Mr. Ogata served as an assistant pastor.

They also served parishes in Fort Dodge, Davenport, and Edina, Minn., before moving to Grinnell in 1973, when the Rev. Mr. Ogata began his tenure as pastor of the First United Presbyterian Church. Mrs. Ogata was employed in the admissions department at Grinnell College.

She is survived by her husband; a daughter, Lynn Carol Ogata, a student at Grinnell College; three brothers, Bill Ogasawara of Seattle, Wash., and Steve and Roy Ogasawara, both of Chicago; two sisters, Terry Kumagai of Minneapolis, Minn., and Mary Muramoto of Chicago; and her mother, Kikue Sato Ogasawara of Seattle.
