Anna Maria Elizabeth Anderson  
was born on the 27th of October, 1881,  
the first child of her parents, Peter  
and Elizabeth Anderson, who then re-  
sided in Malcom township.

In her infancy she was given to the  
Lord in holy baptism. She grew up  
on the farm. Having acquired a clear  
understanding of the teaching of the  
Word of God regarding our salvation,  
she, with seven other young girls,  
made profession of faith and was by  
confirmation taken into the communi-  
on of the Lutheran church.

On the 10th of December she was  
married to Mr. John Orland, who is  
left to mourn his loss. Two children  
were born to this union, Gladys and  
Grant.

In February a year ago she was tak-  
en with the grippe. A bad cough  
troubled her after this and soon the  
sad fact became known that she had  
consumption. The disease ran its  
course as in most other cases. Although  
she knew that she had consumption,  
and had in the beginning of her sick-  
ness already come to the conclusion  
that she had to die, still hope of life  
was born in her again and especially  
towards the last she entertained hopes  
of recovery. She was not confined to  
bed and divided the time which was  
spared her between her home in the  
country and her parents' home in  
town, where she was not only more  
conveniently attended by the doctor,  
but where a mother's and father's care  
and love could be shown her to the last.  
There she also ended her life on Tues-  
day evening, after having returned  
from her home on Monday. She  
breathed her last at 5:30, Tuesday  
evening, August 14th.

Besides her loving husband and two  
infant children she leaves in sorrow  
her father and mother and two broth-  
ers, besides numerous other relatives.  
May God give them comfort. The  
days of her short earthly pilgrimage  
are 24 years, 9 months and 17 days.

Let us hope that she has exchanged  
this short life full of sorrow and tribu-  
lation for life eternal, the gift of our  
Savior.
