Claus Ohland was born in
Schleswig, Holstein, vicinity
of Hamburg, Germany, August 2, 1867, and died at St.

of Hamburg, Germany, August 2, 1867, and died at St. Francis hospital in Grinnell Dec. 17, 1963, at the age of 96.

His parents were John H. Chland, who died June 26, 1899, and Anna Chland, who died in December, 1924. When he was an infant, his parents sailed to America and he became one-year-old on the ocean voyage.

The family first settled in Scott county, Iowa, and later in Poweshiek county where Mr. Ohland lived on the home place 8-1/2 miles northeast of Malcom until 1946 when he and his sister moved to their present home in Malcom.

Funeral services were held December 19 at Bramer Funeral Home in charge of the Rev. James T. Robinson, pastor of the Malcom Methodist church. Mrs. Ed Bartachek was organist. His body was cremated.

He is survived by his sister, Anna, who until recently cared for him, and several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by three brothers, Mark, John and Henry, and a sister, Rose.

Except for the handicap of dearness, Mr. Ohland enjoyed a long healthy life. His favorite hobby was fishing and was a familiar figure on the banks of the Iowa river.
