Later, Mr. Ohland and his wife moved to Iowa County and farmed for eight years near Marengo. In 1956, the couple moved to Grinnell. Mr. Ohland was employed with the food service at Grinnell College before his retirement.

He was a member of the Trinity Lutheran Church near Malcom and was also a member of the World War I Barracks and the American Legion.

He is survived by his wife, Lenora; one son, Paul Ohland of Northwood; one daughter, Mrs. Louis (Helen) Sandersfeld of Williamsburg; nine grandchildren; one great-grandson; and four sisters, Mrs. Etta Jackson and Miss Edith Ohland, both of Grinnell, Mrs. Florence Sack of Pella and Mrs. Victor (Mary) Varnum of Tama.

He was preceded in death by his parents and one brother, Fred Ohland.
